

Notes of the Warley Community Association Open Meeting at The Maypole, Warley Town 6:30pm 25th July 2022

1. Welcome, attendance and Apologies

There is currently a lot of night-time activity in the car park but no progress seems to have been made in trying to reduce this nuisance.

5. Events and next Warley Lantern.

It is expected to be higher than last year – there will need to be a trade-off between possible lost sales by increasing the price and the need to make a profit from the sales. Hopefully it will be a relatively small increase.
